

REPORT on a MEETING of the
ENTERTAINMENTS COMMITTEE of the
SCOTTISH POTATO TRADE ASSOCIATION
in 25 South Methven Street, PERTH
at 12 Noon on Friday, 22nd March,
1991.

PRESENT: Messrs. J.R. McArthur and R. Doig (both ex officio),

DINNER-
DANCE 1991: In respect that the Salutation Hotel, Perth had
sought confirmation of a provisional Dinner-Dance re-
booking held for Friday, 13th December, 1991 not later
than today's date, the Committee considered precirculated
notes on the results of alternative enquiries instructed.
Revealing a straightforward choice between the Queens and
Salutation Hotels in Perth, the Committee decided to
confirm the provisional booking with the Queens Hotel on
the basis of 95-100 participants and no room hire charge
and thereafter to cancel the provisional booking with the
Salutation Hotel. Preliminary calculations indicated
1991 Tickets would cost £14.00 each.
